

- SCGIS works to assist conservationists worldwide in using GIS through communication, networking, scholarships, and training.
- Membership is open to any individual seeking assistance in the achievement of personal or organizational conservation goals.
- As a non-profit, SCGIS uses a fee-based membership to provide services directly to members.
- No individual will be turned away for lack of funds.
 Individuals may elect to sponsor others with little or no budget.

Communication:


- Email listsery used by members to maintain discussions, ask questions and give answers

Periodical publications:

- Publish a peer reviewed journal and hard-copy newsletter to promote the exchange of ideas and methodologies relevant to conservation GIS
- Bi-annual (or quarterly, when possible) electronic newsletter, available at the web-site

 The Annual SCGIS International Conference brings together 150-200 conservation GIS professionals from all over the world, providing a unique opportunity to meet, network and share ideas

Traditionally, the conference is coordinated in time with the annual ESRI User Conference.

Grants include ESRI products – software, books, training, and more.


SCGIS scholars receive two weeks of free GIS training, and are provided registration fee waiver at the conferences they attend

In 1999, it was announced that SCGIS chapter is created in Germany...

...but we haven't heard any news from them since then





In Russia, various communitybuilding efforts have been in place:

- 1-3 GIS trainings for conservationists are conducted each year since 1995
- Two Conservation GIS Conferences were organized in 2000 and 2002
- A GIS technology web-site, with a strong focus on conservation and action to promote more liberal access to GIS data, is up and running (http://gis-lab.info)



- Conservation GIS Conference was organized in 2001 in Chile, but there were no follow-up activities for a few years.
- A new kind of chapter gradually emerged that connects conservation GIS activists in Spanish speaking Latin America, in countries ranging from Argentina to Mexico.



SCGIS Madagascar has a real office – the only SCGIS office in the world!

In 2003, they organized a conference that was attended by 80 Malagasy conservation GIS users and guests from India, Kenya, and Russia.



SCGIS Slovenia provides GIS training, hosts a GIS web-site, and server for non-profit GIS projects





In February 2006, SCGIS Kenya was officially launched, and in July 2007 they organized the first conference in Nairobi attended by over 200 people. This was followed by another successful conference in 2009.





In June 2006,

SCGIS Pilipinas

was officially launched in the Philippines!







In Brazil, SCGIS members have been organizing meetings since 2006, and in 2009 this culminated in the official chapter launch conference.

Since then, the chapter has been working on preparing a book on Conservation GIS in Brazil. This book will be published this summer, and presented at the next chapter conference held in cooperation with the Brazilian Congress for Landscape Ecology in September 2012.

SCGIS Cameroon members hold regular meetings and organize workshops on GIS and GPS use for protection of remaining intact forests.







The growing SCGIS Nepal organizes regular workshops to strengthen community based applications of GIS with the goal to better manage protected areas and traditional use areas.

SCGIS Indonesia chapter was created in 2009, and had its inaugural conference in 2010. The chapter periodically organizes GIS trainings for conservation organizations.





 SCGIS chapters are also working in Uganda, Zambia, and South Africa as a region

 SCGIS Japan was created in 2011, and is now in the process of defining its directions.


